Opportunities to meet the equity challenge this session:

Early Childhood Education: More infants, toddlers and preschool-age children should have the quality experiences that set them up for success in school. Invest in child care for infants and toddlers through Working Connections Child Care. Expand the Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP) — support House Bill 1351. Health and Wellbeing: When parents have access to health care, children do better in school and in life. Expand dental therapy to kids and families statewide support House Bill 1317. Include dental coverage in the COFA Islander Health Care program— support Senate Bill 5274.
